Guidance Notes Verification of Identity for Self-Represented Parties

The Registrar-General's Verification of Identity (VOI) Requirements necessitate that parties to a Lands Titles Office (LTO) Registry Instrument must have their identity verified. These requirements reduce the risk of land title fraud and any other improper dealings with land in South Australia.

What is a Self-Represented Party?

LAND

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Self-Represented Parties are individuals who choose to prepare their own documentation to be lodged with Land Services SA rather than employing the services of a Registered Conveyancer or Legal Practitioner.

What does this mean for me?

As a Self-Represented Party entering into a 'conveyancing transaction' you are responsible for verifying your identity in accordance with the VOI Requirements.

How do I verify my identity?

You are required to show your evidence (as per the attached Table 1) to a Justice of the Peace, Proclaimed Police Officer, Legal Practitioner, Registered Conveyancer or a Notary Public (see Table 3 for their contact information).

These authorised persons will then need to fill in a Certification (See Table 4) and endorse photocopies of the evidence as "true copies of the originals sighted".

What do I need to lodge with Land Services SA?

You will need to attach the endorsed copies of the above mentioned evidence together with the completed Certification to the Real Property Dealing before lodgement with Land Services SA.

Land Services SA will then check the evidence produced and the Real Property dealing before accepting the lodgement.

does have the required evidence. They then will make a declaration in regards your identity.
That "declarant" would then need to produce their identity documentation when they attend the interview with the Authorised Persons (as identified in Table 3). The declarant CANNOT be a ** <i>relative</i> , must be an adult and cannot be party to the transaction.
Refer to the Appendix A for excerpt of Requirement Clause 6.3 for details of what is required to be stated in the declaration. A blank pro-forma of the information to be provided within the declaration is enclosed.
For those people that are not Australian Citizens or Residents, you will need to utilise Category 6a or 6b.

*An expired Australian passport which has not been cancelled and was current within the preceding 2 years may be produced.

**The definition of a 'relative' is: a person's spouse or domestic partner or a child, grandchild, sibling, parent or grandparent of the person or of the person's spouse or domestic partner.

APPENDIX A – IDENTIFIER DECLARATION

The Identifier Declaration is required when category 5 is used. The declarant must be satisfied before providing a statutory declaration to support the identification of the person being identified.

Excerpt from Clause 6.3 within the Verification of Requirements ("Identifier Declaration")

The Declarant is to provide the Verifier with a statutory declaration in which the Declarant declares the following:

- a) the Declarant's name and address; and
- b) the Declarant's occupation; and
- c) the Declarant's date of birth; and
- d) the nature of the Declarant's relationship with the Person Being Identified; and
- e) that the Declarant is not a Relative of the Person Being Identified; and
- f) that the Declarant is not a party to the Conveyancing Transaction; and
- g) the length of time that the Declarant has known the Person Being Identified; and
- h) that to the Declarant's knowledge, information and belief the Person Being Identified is who they purport to be

TABLE 2 – WHEN USING CATEGORY 5(B) TO VERIFY YOUR IDENTITY

The following people are authorised to make the declaration to verify your identity:

- **Bank Manager** (a person appointed to be in charge of the head office or any branch office of an Authorised Deposit-Taking Institution (ADI) carrying on business in Australia under the *Banking Act 1959* (Cth)).
- **Community Leader** (Aboriginal Elder, Member of Aboriginal Council, Member/Staff of Torres Strait Regional Authority, Member/Staff of the Board of Indigenous Business Australia or Indigenous Land Corporation and Member/Staff of Aboriginal Land Council)
- **Court Officer** (a Judge, Master, Magistrate, Registrar, Clerk or Chief Executive Officer of any Court in Australia)
- Medical Practitioner (a person registered under the Health Practitioner Regulation National Law (South Australia) Act 2010 (SA) or corresponding law in another state, to practise in the medical profession (other than a student)
- Land Council Officeholder (A Chairperson or Deputy Chairperson of an Australian Land Council or Land & Sea Council established under Commonwealth, State or Territory Law)
- Local Government Officeholder (Chief Executive Officer or Deputy CEO of a metropolitan or regional council established under the Local Government Act 1999 (SA) or corresponding law of another state)
- Nurse (a person currently registered under the *Health Practitioner Regulation National Law (South Australia)* Act 2010 (SA) or a corresponding law of another State, to practise in the nursing and midwifery profession as a nurse (other than as a student).
- **Public Servant** (a person currently employed in the Public Service under the *Public Sector Act 2009* (SA) or a corresponding law of another State or the Australian Public Service under the *Public Service Act 1999* (Cth)).
- Legal Practitioner (a person currently entitled to practise the profession of law under the *Legal Practitioners Act 1981* (SA) or a corresponding law of another State).
- **Conveyancer** (a person currently registered under the *Conveyancers Act 1994* (SA) or a corresponding law of another State, to carry on a business that consists of or involves the preparation of conveyancing instruments for fee or reward).
- **Police Officer** (a member of South Australia Police under the *Police Act 1998* (SA), or the police force of another State under a corresponding legislation, or the Australian Federal Police under the *Australian Federal Police Act 1979* (Cth)).
